I've been a student of Jim Donak's for approximately five years now, training in trampoline skills at Circus Center for the bulk of that time.

Under Jim's instruction, I've been able to acquire skills that I never imagined I'd be able to accomplish. It's not an easy task to start a gymnastic discipline at the age of 39. Jim's teaching has systematically guided me to acquiring those skills, often before I'd even fully realized how the fundamental components I was learning fit together, until I suddenly realized I could perform a skill that was unimaginable a year or two earlier.

Jim's depth of experience also makes tailoring individual instruction to students of differing experience levels in the same class seem second nature, and his knowledge of anatomy, stretching, and other training has helped me improve off the trampoline in ways that help my gymnastic skills as well.
